



- The Gayxample (from the Spanish terms gay and ensanche, in Catalan gai and Eixample) is the name by which a central area in the Ensanche District of Barcelona is popularly known, in which, since the end of the 20th century, shops and entertainment venues aimed at the LGBTQ+ community have proliferated, becoming a pink zone within the city.
- La Barceloneta is a seaside neighborhood with surf culture. You may sunbathe on the beach or eat outdoors at traditional seafood and tapas bars. San Sebastian is the beach located furthest to the west and one of the oldest and nudist beaches in the city.
- Paseo de Gracia is one of the main avenues of Barcelona and one of the most famous in Catalonia, due to its tourist importance, commercial areas, businesses and a great showcase of outstanding works of modernist architecture, such as the buildings by the architects Antoni Gaudí and Lluís Domènech i Montaner, declared a World Heritage Site.
- Montjuic is a mountain in Barcelona with a height of 177 meters above sea level. Currently, it is closely related to sports, due to the large number of sports facilities it houses, but it is also a good option to disconnect, have a romantic walk, it is plenty of cultural areas or just for a drink with views of the city.
