



- Chueca is a central neighborhood of Madrid. In the 1980s, some of the first premises dedicated to the profile of the LGBTQ+ community were opened in the area (Café Figueroa, Black & White, Sachas or the Berkana bookstore) and progressively it began to achieve the open cosmopolitan character that it has meant for the neighborhood the recognition of its cultural appeal of international fame, without losing part of the original castizo air.
- The Madrid Pride Festival, popularly known as the LGBTQ+ Pride of Madrid and by its acronym MADO (Madrid Pride), are the festivals celebrated by the Chueca neighborhood, in the center of Madrid, the weekend after the 28th of June, International LGBTQ+ Pride Day.
- The Retiro Park is popularly known as El Retiro. It is a historic garden and public park located near the center and it is considered one of the main tourist attractions due to its architectural and landscape figures from the 17th to the 21st century
- One of the most used sayings in the city is the following: "From Madrid to heaven". It is something like that as in this city, nowhere. In addition, there are numerous terraces where you can have a drink and enjoy the views of the capital so this saying makes more sense than ever
