BEACHES

Middle Bay Beach (Hong Kong Island)

Middle Bay Beach is a popular gay beach in Hong Kong attracting both locals and visitors. As it is not directly accessible by public transport, visitors have to walk from Repulse Bay to Middle Bay Beach.

South Bay Beach (Hong Kong Island)

Less busy than Middle Bay Beach, South Bay Beach is still popular with tourists and locals. There is no direct public transport to South Bay Beach so visitors have to walk from Repulse Bay.

Cheung Sha Beach (Lantau Island)

Located on the south coast of Lantau Island, Cheung Sha Beach is one of Hong Kong's longest and most beautiful beaches, splitting into two sections by a rocky outcrop. *Nude sunbathing is illegal in Hong Kong.
