VILLAGE

In 20 years, the « Gay Village » has become the most notable success story to come from the Montreal gay community's demographics and market power. Located more or less within the sector enclosed by Berri, Ontario and Papineau streets and by René-Lévesque Blvd to the south, what was once the « Faubourg à Mélasse » has since gradually grown into the gay district when in 1982 and 1983 many bars for men, such as MAX, were opening up along St. Catherine St. The Village is now home to about 300 businesses, represented by the *Société de Développement Commercial du Village*, catering mainly to the LGBT community: bars, restaurants, boutiques, hotels, as well as businesses offering professional, technical or esthetic services.

L'OLYMPIA DE MONTRÉAL

For several decades, The National Theater housed the greatest artists of Quebec burlesque and melodrama: including Tizoune (father), Juliette Petrie, Francine Grimaldi, etc.
