# Clubs & Nightlife

The nightclub named after a carved wooden sea serpent from a Coney Island carousel became a bona fide hit from the get go. With its fine dining experience and classic Disco it became legendary hosting many celebrities from the political and film world.

Splash Bar New York (SBNY) has evolved into a world-wide phenomenon in the Gay Nightclub scene. The club has featured many famous guest performers such as Brittany Spears and Patti Labelle and has been used as a set location for Sex & the City.

50 West 17th Street (212) 691-0073

This 14,000-square-foot gay dance club—backed by nightlife legends John Blair and Beto Sutter—features an LED wall, two dance floors and a 200-seat cabaret theater.

Located in a former carriage house and warehouse, the conversion was executed using natural materials, opening the space while retaining a warm and therapeutic feel. The space was designed by architect **James Bartholomew** in collaboration with **Tom Johnson**.
