The Langham, London has an unrivalled location, situated within the four most famous villages in London: Marylebone, Soho, Mayfair and Fitzrovia. An array of luxury shops, museums, restaurants, bars and clubs are within 15-minute walk from the hotel to accommodate all your needs.



#### MARYLEBONE

Marylebone is distinguished by leafy streets lined with stately period homes of Georgian architecture. Widely recognized as home to Conan Doyle's most celebrated detective, Sherlock Holmes, Marylebone offers unique finds such as The Wallace Collection art gallery and places to eat that include La Fromagerie and The Golden Hind.

#### FITZROVIA

Previously known as London's 'Old Latin Quarter', Fitzrovia is home to media organisations, a concentration of art galleries, restaurants and a variety of local pubs. This urban village was also home to Virginia Woolf, English writer and modernist of the twentieth century, who lived in 29 Fitzroy Square from 1907 – 1911.

#### MAYFAIR

Mayfair, one of the oldest villages in London, is a haven of luxury shopping, Michelin-starred restaurants, private members' clubs and renowned art galleries. Enclosed within Regent Street, Piccadilly, Oxford Street and Park Lane, the area is steeped in art and culture, with galleries such as Halcyon Gallery and several prominent auction houses just minutes away from SOHO

Diverse, fun and vibrant, Soho offers some of the most exciting nightlife venues in London catering to all tastes from live jazz to eclectic. The area's main artery, Shaftesbury Avenue, is thronged with an array of theatres and cinemas such as the Curzon, and is known as 'Theatreland'.

**The Wallace Collection,** Hertford House, Manchester Square, W1U 3BN National art museum in historic London townhouse spanning over 25 galleries.

**Halcyon Gallery,** 144-146 New Bond Street, W1S 1SN Contemporary gallery housing a diverse programme of works, showing both modern masters and new emerging talents.

**Dominion Theatre,** 268-269 Tottenham Court Road, W1T 7AQ 1920's art deco theatre located on Tottenham Court Road, showing world-famous West End and Broadway shows.
