Nightlife

Oz Nightclub, 120 Gouger Street Adelaide SA 5000

Adelaide's main gay bar and nightclub has been an institution for Adelaide's gay community for years. Oz nightclub formerly "The Mars Bar" features highly entertaining drag shows as well as comedy and live performances. Everyone's welcome.

Marys poppin, 5 Synagogue Place Adelaide SA 5000

This eccentric new LGBT club in the heart of the east end is a push against the trend of small, hip bars in Adelaide and doubles as a cocktail club and performance venue, with regular drag and burlesque shows. Everyone is welcome at Mary's poppin and better yet, it's free entry.

Sugar, 274 Rundle Street Adelaide SA 5000

Sugar is another Adelaide institution. Established in 2002 it is one of the few places in the city that is open almost every night and features some of Adelaide's best home grown DJ's and international acts.
