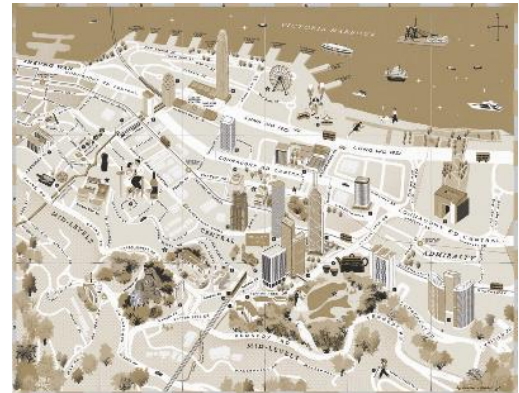

Teas at Teakha are inspired by the multitude of teas popular amongst street cultures all over the world, where tea stalls or teahouses are often gathering grounds for conversations. Tea leaves are sourced from small plantations all over the world to produce single origin cups which complement Teakha's signature drop scones, cheesecakes and chiffon cakes as teatime accompaniments.
