Pottinger Street (also known as the Stone Slab Street)

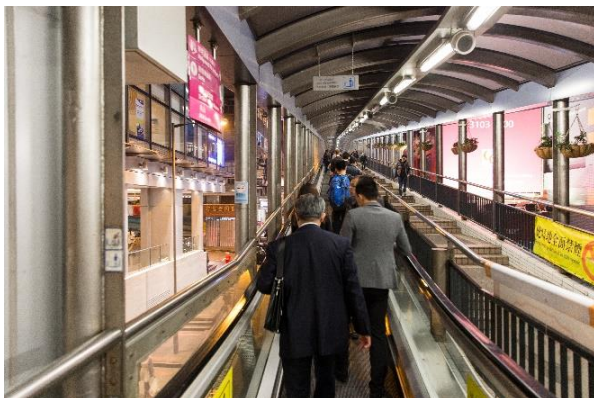
Pottinger Street, Central

The Chinese name of Pottinger Street translates as ‘Stone Slab Street’ – and it’s easy to see why. The original section was built on a steep slope, and is composed of granite steps. The English name derives from Hong Kong’s first governor, Sir Henry Pottinger. The street is a popular place to find souvenirs, accessories, and fancy-dress costumes.

Hong Kong Tram

Throughout Hong Kong Island

The city's most historical transportation tool. These double-decker streetcars have been travelling through Hong Kong's busiest thoroughfares since 1904 and continue to be an affordable, inexpensive and fun way to get around.



The Central–Mid-Levels Escalator

Across Des Voeux Road Central to Conduit Road

The Central–Mid-Levels Escalator is the world's longest covered outdoor escalator. The stretch is over 800 meters and will take you up 135 meters through the steep hillside of Central. It links Des Voeux Road Central near the harbour to Conduit Road in the Mid-Levels. Travelling its entire length takes around 20 minutes and it's a convenient and fun way to check out the SOHO area where you can find great restaurants and shops.

PMQ

No.35 Aberdeen Street, Central

Originally the Police Married Quarters, the historic site now known as PMQ has been revitalised as a hub for creative and design industries. It houses a wide variety of creative enterprises, ranging from fashion and accessories to household products and designer furniture. Different markets, music events and exhibitions are staged throughout the years as well.



Western Market

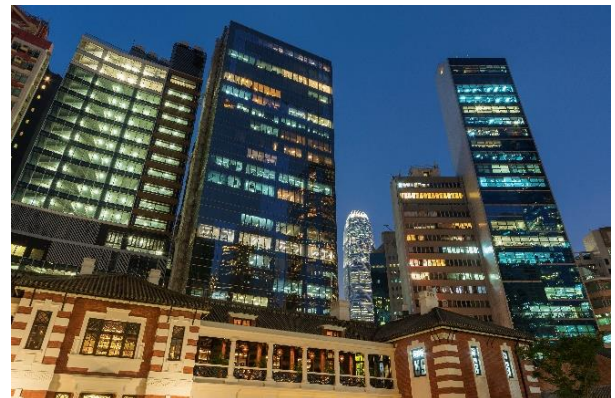
No.323 Des Voeux Road, Sheung Wan

Considered the oldest market building in Hong Kong. This Edwardian-style red brick structure features granite archway and its unique towers. The market was completed in 1906 and operated till the late 1980's. The structure was renovated after its closure and opened its doors again in 1991 to cafes, restaurants, souvenir shops and fabric stores.

Tai Kwun

No.10 Hollywood Road, Central

Opened in 2018, Tai Kwun presents a wide range of heritage, contemporary art, performing arts and lifestyle experiences in the restored and revitalised Central Police Station compound, which comprises three Declared Monuments, the former Central Police Station, the Central Magistracy and Victoria Prison.

Sevva (Continental Cuisine)

25/F, The Landmark Prince's Building, Central

Nectar (Vegetarian Cuisine)

108 Hollywood Road, Soho, Central

Refined and inventive, experience progressive, plant-based cuisine prepared by Chef Peggy Chan. Nectar's approach is centred around the creation of dishes that are nutritious, sustainable, nourishing and enlightening.

Distance: 5 to 10-minute walk



Mott 32 (Cantonese Fusion Cuisine)

Basement, Standard Chartered Bank Building, 4 Des Voeux Road, Central

Mott 32 is a celebration of Chinese culture and cuisine. With an impressive roster of Cantonese, Sichuan and Beijing dishes, the restaurant touts itself on sourcing prime ingredients worldwide.

Dress code: Smart casual
Distance: 5 to 10-minute walk



Osteria (Italian Cuisine)

41 Fleming Road, Wan Chai

Osteria Marzia is a coastal Italian restaurant inspired by the colourful and diverse cuisine of the nation's scenic seaside regions. From Campania through Amalfi and Puglia to Southern Sicily, flavours vary along the coast. A menu representing these cooking traditions is proudly served in a lofty dining room, accented with nautical design and details reminiscent of a sunny maritime holiday in Italy.



Dress code: Smart casual

Distance: 10-15 minute by MTR

Yung Kee Restaurant (Traditional Chinese Cuisine)

G/F, 160-164 Wellington Street, Central

Founded in 1942, Yung Kee Restaurant is striving for its principle to present the essence of authentic Cantonese cuisine and the pursuit of real taste in quality dishes. It is famous for its specialty roasted goose and many other culinary classics. The restaurant has won over 100 culinary awards worldwide and has been regularly visited by celebrities.

From Hatton Road to The Peak

A pleasant 2800m walk from the end of Conduit Road straight up to the Peak Circle walk which you will gain access to an amazing 180-degree view of Hong Kong's scenery.
