OAK LAWN

Voted the number one "gayborhood" in the nation by Out Traveler, Oak Lawn is the epicenter of LGBTQ culture in Dallas.
Gay bars and nightclubs are commonplace in this popular neighborhood and its culinary scene is nothing less than noteworthy. We recommend Street's Fine Chicken or La Ventana to taste the local flavors, followed by drinks at Roy G's and dancing at Round-Up Saloon. The neighborhood is also very walkable, and less than two miles away from Downtown Dallas and other notable districts.

ARTS DISTRICT

Go see a show at the Winspear Opera House, or peruse the Dallas Museum of Art before grabbing a bite at Musume! Insider tip: grab a cocktail in the speakeasy, Akai, after dinner. They'll lead you through the kitchen and back of house to the swanky, upbeat spot that comes alive as the night goes on.

BISHOP ARTS DISTRICT

Head to the Bishop Arts District, another unique Dallas spot, where funky and chic dominate. Pick up a hand-printed map of Dallas, or find irresistible tchotchkes, while sampling some of the city's best gems. Whether you're looking for the craft cocktail epicenter (Botanist), or the home of Dallas' best pie (Emporium Pies), Bishop Art has got it all.

DOWNTOWN DALLAS

Knock some of Dallas' most famous landmarks off your list- take a photo at "the eye," head up to the Reunion Tower Observation deck, and grab a bite from the food trucks at Klyde Warren Park.
