



## The Edge & Box Bar

The Edge & Box Bar is an award-winning venue and Southampton's premier LGBTQ+ nightclub located in the heart of the city's nightlife district. The club has a fun, friendly, and alternative atmosphere and is known for its drag shows and themed parties. The Edge & Box Bar is open every night of the week, with different events and DJs on each night. It's a great place to dance, have a few drinks, and meet new people.



## The London Hotel

The London Hotel is one of Southampton's most popular LGBTQ+ bars and home to some of the best cabaret shows on the south coast. An unpretentious, welcoming venue it is known for its drag shows and queer-themed events, making it one of the best spots in the city centre to visit as an LGBTQ+ traveller, whether for a casual drink or a more serious night out.



## The Mayflower Theatre

Unsurprisingly for a 2,000-seat venue, The Mayflower Theatre plays host to some major West End productions. 'Les Misérables' has been here, as has 'Hairspray' and 'West Side Story'. The theatre also attracts major music and comedy acts, with Kate Bush, Rolling Stones, Jimmy Carr and Ricky Gervais all having graced the stage. ## Harbour Lights Picturehouse
